Call to Order

Chair T. Hudrlik (MN) called the meeting to order at 11:00 am ET. All voting members were present, a quorum was established.

Approval of Agenda and Minutes

A motion by Commissioner C. Moore (GA) to approve the meeting’s agenda was adopted.

A motion by Commissioner D. Cady (NH) to approve the minutes from December 4, 2025 was adopted.

Discussion

Pilot State Update: DCA B. Kojis (WI) highlighted the benefits of the RNR Framework tool, noting that it consolidates information previously spread across multiple reports and allows for more detailed information than violation reports, which are often limited. She also has observed improvements in both documentation and decision-making.

Executive Director A. Lippert added that, although the framework provides a decision outcome, a receiving state can still override decisions based on individual circumstances.

The committee discussed that the RNR Workgroup is currently focused on potential modifications to the framework tool itself. If the Chapter 5 Rules require additional changes, the RNR Workgroup and the Executive Committee additional recommendations.

RNR Chapter 5 rule recommendations: Executive Director A. Lippert presented a revised table of contents for Chapter 5, highlighting changes including the removal of certain rules, reorganization of content, and incorporating the directive to return into 5.101. She explained that the rules will support the framework tool and provide discretion for states in decision-making. The reporting violations section was consolidated for clarity, and no changes were made to rules regarding pending felony charges or the discretionary process.

The committee discussed the proposed rule changes.

DCA K. O'Leary (MA) raised a concern regarding how Rule 5.102(b) conveys discretion in the retaking process, and the Committee expressed support for her concern. Due to time constraints, the national office and Chair T. Hudrlik (MN) will follow up on the issue offline.

Chair T. Hudrlik (MN) and Commissioner A. Vorachek (ND) will also meet with the national office to discuss introducing the framework to the full Commission and messaging in advance of the Annual Business Meeting.
